

# Legaux helps unbeaten Karr pass 4th-down test

## *Cougars take care of Destrehan 38-24*

Karr quarterback Munchie Legaux has a flair for the dramatic.

Scoring on first, second or third-down didn't suit Legaux and his Cougars teammates. Karr was all about getting to the end zone on fourth-down

against Destrehan.

Legaux threw all four of his touchdown passes on fourth down to take the steam out of Wildcats defense, pushing Karr to a 38-24 victory over Destrehan on Friday night at Wildcat Stadium.

Karr Coach Jabbar Juluke said scoring nearly every touchdown on fourth down wasn't the way they drew it up on the game plan.

"We will take them (touchdowns) any way we can get them," Juluke said. "It certainly wasn't planned to wait until

fourth down, but from Munchie all the way down the line, we played excellent."

Legaux was 14-of-26 passing for 206 yards and four touchdowns. Legaux said he thought the Cougars (3-0) started slow, but things started clicking as the game progressed.

"Everyone else was playing fine, but I didn't have my game when we first started," Legaux said. "Once I found my game, things started working."

Legaux received plenty of help from wide receiver Jarrell Bennett for Karr's first fourth-

down scoring strike. Legaux lead to 12-10, Legaux was at it found Bennett on a quick slant again. The Wildcats stuffed and Bennett used his speed and Karr three times inside the shifty moves to cut through the 5-yard line, but Legaux went to Destrehan defense for a 31-yard the air once again on fourth-down to make the score down, finding De'Ante' Arm-6-0 with 8:38 remaining in the strong for a 5-yard touchdown first quarter.

The Karr senior quarterback quarter to put Karr ahead showed poise once again less 18-10.

Legaux mixed in a 10-yard touchdown run on the next his right on fourth-and-18 and drive, but he wasn't done. He connected with Tavis Clark threw another fourth-down down the sideline. Clark's touch-touchdown pass, this time to down made the score 12-0. Armstrong rom 11 yards out

After Destrehan cut the Karr with 9:38 remaining to

After winning 30 consecutive games including the first game this season, the Wildcats (1-2) have lost their past two games.

Destrehan quarterback Taylor Dunn threw two late touchdown passes, including one to freshman Ricky Jefferson, the younger brother of LSU quarterback Jordan Jefferson.
